1. Comments Received During Webinar

2. Comments Received via Digital Submission

2a. Kenneth Teague

- Digital Submission

Dear Sir/Ms: I have reviewed the Draft 2022 Comprehensive Plan Update, and I have the following comments:

- Clarify that the RESTORE program will not fund unfunded local infrastructure needs that are not truly related to coastal environmental quality, but rather represent states and local governments abusing the RESTORE program to pay for unrelated needs/wants. Examples include hurricane protection levee repairs, drainage improvements, parks, boat ramps, restrooms, piers, beach nourishment strictly for tourism, etc.
- Clarify that the RESTORE program will not fund efforts to open naturally-ephemeral tidal passes, simply because people want more fish, easier boat access to the Gulf, etc. Artificial efforts to keep tidal passes open are ARTIFICIAL. They do not constitute ecosystem restoration. While they are wildly popular with boaters and fishermen, they are not coastal ecosystem restoration.
- Clarify that the RESTORE program will not fund coastal wetland impoundment or semi-impoundment. These are traditional coastal wetland management approaches that are largely not based on science, and are intended to engineer the marsh to support a particular coastal resource, at the expense of others- waterfowl for example.
- Clarify why the RESTORE program places such a high value on restoring old oil and gas sites. I have yet to see an explanation for why this is a priority. While oil and gas canals in coastal wetlands clearly need to be restored to wetlands and shallow water habitats, this is not what is proposed. Rather, it seems that old wellheads are being removed and presumably, some kind of restoration of soil and vegetation at the small sites is proposed as well. However, while intuitively it may seem this is something that should be done, when considered in a detailed manner, the reasons for making this a priority for coastal restoration are not clear. RESTORE should have to defend its priority on this, and the scientific support for its prioritization should be reviewed by coastal scientists.
- Clarify that the RESTORE program will not fund programs that States or others strongly desire to see funded, but have little or no relationship to coastal environmental management or restoration. RESTORE should focus on funding things that clearly, primarily support coastal environmental management and restoration, not somebody's pet project that can't be funded otherwise.
- RESTORE should CAREFULLY review Texas' Chenier Plain Ecosystem Restoration Program, and its supporting documents, to ensure consistency with RESTORE requirements. This program has

several problems, and has spawned a number of problematic projects, including some that actually degraded the coastal environment. The program proposes maintaining existing semi-impoundments, and may propose new impoundments. It proposed, and implemented a scheme to create a large unnatural clay levee behind the beach to protect lower salinity marshes from saltwater intrusion, resulting in a series of unnatural, linear borrow pits landward of the beach, for many miles. These impacts are visible from space. The program may have supported marsh restoration using contaminated dredged material, and may have provided material support to large, wealthy industries to assist them in meeting their legal regulatory mitigation requirements.

- Clarify that RESTORE program will only fund acquisition of coastal habitats that are a demonstrated priority for coastal environmental management or restoration. Just because acquisition of a property is desirable from an environmental conservation perspective, does not mean it is desirable from a COASTAL environmental conservation perspective. Benefits to coastal ecosystems should either be obvious, or they should be demonstrated. In addition, coastal habitat acquisition using RESTORE funds should only be undertaken when the habitat is under demonstrable risk of degradation. Not all coastal habitats are equally at risk of degradation. It is a poor use of limited funding to acquire habitats that are at low risk of degradation.
- RESTORE program should acknowledge that the large emphasis on oyster restoration is not based on much scientific information. Oyster habitat in the Gulf is not well mapped, and is certainly not well understood based on more detailed ecological indicators. Yet, we are spending large sums of money, presumably to restore a habitat that is not even well known. RESTORE should invest first in robust monitoring and research on oyster reefs. The results of such a program should form the foundation of a future effort to actually restore these habitats.
- RESTORE should clarify it will only fund watershed management efforts that are explicitly focused on protecting and restoring COASTAL water quality. This should require specification of what water quality problems or parameters are being protected or restored. While this approach may also benefit non-coastal water quality, the primary emphasis should be on explicitly-stated coastal water quality objectives.
- RESTORE should justify its strong support for Living Shorelines. While I support living shorelines vs traditional hard shoreline protection, I do not believe living shorelines are a panacea for all coastal problems (unlike some).
- I recommend that RESTORE prioritize funding partly based on the proposed activity's congruence with actual impacts of the Deepwater Horizon incident. To this end, I recommend RESTORE prioritize actions in habitats closer to the Gulf vs farther away. For example, barrier island habitats were impacted, and are at great risk of degradation in Texas. Appropriate actions to protect and restore Texas barrier islands should therefore be prioritized in the Texas RESTORE program.

- PEPC Direct Submission
 - The Draft 2022 Comprehensive Plan Update rightly places a priority on protecting the natural resources of the Gulf Coast ecosystems. The Draft also introduces the idea of resiliency being included as a factor however this seems to be a stand alone thought and a minor one at that. While the 2022 update includes a new commitment to “Apply[ing] science-based decision-making”, the link between that and actions that address resiliency is not drawn distinctly enough. Understanding the potential for significant climate change impacts to the region, the Council would benefit from incorporating the science-based data from the myriad climate scientists into the strategic plan so that the restoration activities are not made worthless with the effects of the changing climate. The Council has a great opportunity to use the Trust funds to establish programs that will make the Gulf Coast area resilient and vibrant for the future and shouldn't waste money on programs that just seek to restore the area to how things were in the past. The past may no longer be a valuable reference goal and the Council should include language to ensure that programs are forward looking, not backwards.

2c. Name Not Provided

- PEPC Direct Submission
 - I recommend the only role the NPS provide is in restoring the gulf coast to it's natural habitat. The NPS should not be involved and or concerned about any economic recovery. The NPS mission is to protect and preserve the natural environment.

It is past time for CONTRACTION. The NPS should remove most facilities to restore areas to a natural habitat, unless the park's theme is of a historical nature, and then only the historical sites should be maintained. Promoting development or growth is going in the wrong direction as evidenced by the backlog of maintenance issues and the invasion of commercialism into parks.

Dear Council Members,

I am writing on behalf of The Nature Conservancy and our five Gulf State Chapters to comment on your 2022 Comprehensive Plan Update—Restoring the Gulf Coast Ecosystem and Economy. TNC appreciates the opportunity to provide input to this important document.

Overall, we believe the document is sound and helpful. We appreciate your detailed descriptions of the history of the RESTORE Council and its implementation of the RESTORE Act and BP Oil Spill Settlement including the roles of the various programs and agencies involved in implementation of Gulf restoration. This explanation allows a clear understanding of where restoration is today and the programmatic foundation enabling further forward movement.

We support the plan as a whole and, particularly, applaud several sections of the document:

1. The emphasis on coordination of programs and projects within the RESTORE Council and with other funding streams from the DWH spill. As we have said in the past, the watershed approach to restoration planning can be an important vehicle for coordinating the various on the ground projects necessary to achieve lasting restoration at scale.
2. Continued reliance on the 2019 Planning Framework to add substance and direction to the Comprehensive Plan.
3. The timing of Funded Priority List preparation to allow settlement funds to accumulate so that large projects can proceed.
4. The development of an effective environmental review process that, while moving restoration projects forward efficiently, respects the substance and spirit of NEPA.
5. Your continuing commitment to using the best available science to design and evaluate the success of projects.

While we are, thus, very pleased with the progress the RESTORE Council is making, we do have a few suggestions as you finalize the 2022 Plan:

1. With respect to coordination of effort across states and agency boundaries, there are now new sources of funding for Gulf restoration such as from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, state and federal coastal resilience programs, the America the Beautiful Challenge and the like. Given its state/federal governance structure, TNC would like to see the RESTORE Council find ways to enhance coordination of these investments with those from the Deepwater Horizon Spill. The watershed approach could help here.
2. While the Council and the states have made good progress at community outreach, TNC's experience in working with local communities across the Gulf suggests that more

affirmative outreach is needed to fully engage underserved communities in participating in planning for Gulf restoration.

3. Oyster restoration is identified as a priority in the Planning Framework, but wild oyster populations are continuing to decline across the Gulf. A more concerted effort is needed by the Council and the NRDA Trustees to address this problem which has both economic and ecological implications.
4. We are concerned that climate change may not be sufficiently taken into account in planning for Gulf projects. Among the factors affecting Gulf restoration are the increasing frequency and intensity of rainfall events which are changing the salinity regimes of Gulf estuaries. We also note the movement of mangroves northward in response to the warming climate.

While we at TNC use the term, “Gulf of Mexico Restoration” all the time including in this letter, we all know that we cannot actually restore the Gulf to some past condition. There is too much change in climate, population growth and development, river modification, technology and economics to allow identifying a past baseline condition and managing back to that point. What we are all really doing is creating a new future for the Gulf based on natural principles and on protecting and restoring the largest pieces of the ecosystem possible. In our view, this is working, but it will require just the kind of broad programmatic thinking reflected in the Council’s revised Comprehensive Plan to continue the progress that has been made.

Thank you again for your great work and for giving us the opportunity to comment.

Dear RESTORE Council Members:

The National Audubon Society (Audubon) is a nonprofit conservation organization whose mission is to protect birds and the places they need, today and tomorrow, throughout the Americas. Audubon has had a presence on the Gulf Coast for nearly a century and is invested thoroughly in the region. Audubon staff are working to advance restoration, conservation, and stewardship with the goal of having healthy and resilient coastal and marine ecosystems that support populations of birds, fish, wildlife, and people throughout the Gulf’s five coastal states. On behalf

of our over 1.8 million members, Audubon appreciates the opportunity to comment on the draft 2022 Comprehensive Plan Update: Restoring the Gulf Coasts Ecosystem and Economy.

We applaud the Council for reaffirming important commitments first laid out in the 2016 Comprehensive Plan Update. Specifically, we support the Council's continued stated commitment to the Priority Criteria, in particular its commitment to prioritizing large-scale projects. We also support the Council's approach on the frequency of future Funded Priorities Lists to allow funds to accrue from the annual BP payouts to permit large-scale restoration projects and programs.

Audubon supported the updated 2019 Submission Criteria which significantly improved the transparency and effectiveness of the project submission and review process. We are strongly supportive of the continuation of these standards for project submission, as well as the updated Best Available Science (BAS) review process that includes both external and internal BAS reviews. We also applaud the Council for its continued commitment to science coordination through the Council Monitoring and Assessment Work Group (CMAWG), as well as the Gulf Restoration Science Program's Ad Hoc Coordination Forum.

We note the Council may be considering a renewal of the Comprehensive Planning Support (CPS) as the original five-year term expires. We are supportive of the continued use of CPS funds to be made available for ongoing and effective coordination. However, we would ask the Council to ensure that only a small amount of funds are used for the purpose of planning and coordination and the bulk of monies go toward restoration projects and monitoring. We appreciate the Council's evaluation of the effectiveness of the CPS program within this Comprehensive Plan update and hope that reflection continues if more CPS funds are released. With any future CPS funds, we encourage the Council to consider ways to enhance coordination with the public and other key stakeholders, particularly underserved communities and those that may be directly affected by any projects under consideration.

We appreciate the Council sharing a progress update on their achievements to date and are pleased to see the level of progress made restoring the Gulf ecosystem nearly 10 years after the passage of the RESTORE Act. We would request that the Council share how their targets were developed and more details of how restoration success is being measured. Moreover, we are glad to see recent emails publicizing the Council members' visits to restoration projects, and we encourage the Council to prioritize sharing similar updates on restoration progress with the public on a more frequent basis. One potential approach could be to publicly highlight one restoration project each quarter.

We support the Council's ongoing commitment to a watershed-based approach to restoration. We would urge the Council to ensure that high-priority ecosystem stressors and needs drive the selection of priority watersheds and ultimately project selection. We also support the Council elevating environmental compliance to a standalone commitment in the updated Comprehensive Plan. We recognize that having efficient, effective, and transparent environmental compliance is key to moving sound projects forward in a timely fashion.

Audubon would like to thank the members of the RESTORE Council and the Council staff for their efforts to set up sound mechanisms for science-based recovery and monitoring of the Gulf ecosystem. Please feel free to reach out if you have any questions regarding our comments.

On behalf of our members in the Gulf region and across the country, we appreciate the opportunity to provide comments on the draft 2022 Comprehensive Plan Update: Restoring the Gulf Coast's Ecosystem and Economy. We thank the RESTORE Council for continuing to be proactive and update the Comprehensive Plan as required by the RESTORE Act and as restoration of the Gulf ecosystem continues to move forward.

We appreciate the RESTORE Council's reaffirmation of important commitments laid out in the 2016 update to the Comprehensive Plan and in the 2019 Planning Framework. Specifically, we support the Council's continued stated commitment to the Priority Criteria, and in particular its commitment to prioritizing large-scale projects. We are also highly supportive of the approach to future Funded Priorities List (FPL) frequency described in the Council Funding Strategy, "to allow funds to accrue over the annual BP payouts to enable the funding of large-scale projects and programs and maximize the use of available resources." (Page 22)

We also support the Council's elevating environmental compliance to a standalone commitment in the updated Comprehensive Plan. We recognize that having efficient, effective and transparent environmental compliance is key to moving sound projects forward in a timely fashion while respecting the substance and spirit of NEPA.

As our organizations have commented previously, we supported the updated 2019 Submission Criteria, which significantly improved the transparency and effectiveness of project submission

and review. We are strongly supportive of the continuation of these standards for project submission, as well as the updated Best Available Science (BAS) review process that includes both external and internal BAS reviews.

We also applaud the Council for its continued commitment to science coordination through the Council Monitoring and Assessment Work Group (CMAWG), as well as the Gulf Restoration Science Program's Ad Hoc Coordination Forum. We encourage the Council/CMAWG to continue to strive to align data management and project tracking with the Natural Resource Damage Assessment process as much as possible, for the sake of comprehensive tracking of restoration progress, to support effective adaptive management, and for the benefit of more cohesive storytelling of restoration successes.

We note the Council may be considering a renewal of the Comprehensive Planning Support (CPS) as the original five-year term expires. We are supportive of a small amount of funds continuing to be made available for ongoing and effective coordination, with as much funding as possible retained for on-the-ground restoration work. We appreciate the Council's evaluation of the effectiveness of the CPS program within this Comprehensive Plan update. With any future CPS funds, we encourage the Council to consider ways to enhance coordination with the public and other key stakeholders, particularly underserved communities that may be affected by any projects under consideration. Affirmative community outreach is needed to engage stakeholders who have not traditionally been involved in these planning processes.

We appreciate the Council sharing a progress update on their achievements to date and are pleased to see the level of progress made restoring the Gulf ecosystem nearly 10 years after the passage of the RESTORE act. We would request the Council share how their "targets" were developed and provide more details of how success is being measured.

We support the Council's ongoing commitment to a watershed/estuary approach. We urge the Council to ensure that high priority ecosystem stressors/needs drive project selection, rather than having priority watersheds/estuaries be selected "as [Members] identify specific projects for implementation within the programs..." (Page 25)

Finally, we also refer the Council back to a letter dated November 5th, 2019, by some of our organizations that outlined recommended best practices for ensuring transparency and accountability in the implementation of programs that were approved without specific projects detailed. Ongoing transparency and clear and measurable goals in executing Council-funded programs are critical to maximizing the opportunity provided by these funds.

We appreciate the efforts of the Council to restore the Gulf ecosystem and for the opportunity to provide comments on this 2022 Comprehensive Plan update.
